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All Kids Tip Sheet

What is All Kids?

All Kids provides health care coverage for uninsured children who live in Illinois and are 18 years of age or younger. Children in households with income greater than 200% Federal Poverty Level (FPL) must have been uninsured for at least twelve months, but there are exceptions to this rule such as if the parent's job ended.

What services does All Kids provide?

All Kids provides comprehensive health care coverage including doctor visits, hospital visits, dental care, vision care, prescription drugs, medical equipment, mental health services and much more.

Is there an income limit for All Kids?

There is no income limit. Copayments and premiums vary by income. Some families get All Kids for free.

What if my child already has insurance?

You can receive up to \$75 each month — if family income is greater than 133% FPL and at or below 200% FPL — to offset the cost of private or employer-based health insurance for each of your children. In some cases where children do not have comprehensive coverage, your child may be eligible for some benefits such as vision and dental.

What if my child is not a citizen?

There are no immigration status requirements for All Kids.

Are pregnant women eligible for All Kids?

Pregnant women also are eligible for All Kids and Moms and Babies up to 200% FPL. If the pregnant woman enrolls in Moms and Babies, her newborn will be enrolled into All Kids as soon as she delivers. There are no immigration status requirements.



What about health insurance for caregivers?

Custodial caregivers of children in All Kids who have an income 185% FPL or less are eligible for FamilyCare.

Parents and children can apply for All Kids and FamilyCare on the same application.

FamilyCare is available to citizens and legal immigrants who have lived in the United States for 5 or more years.

FamilyCare covers doctor visits, preventive dental care, specialty medical services, hospital care, emergency services, prescription drugs and more.
