### HAWKS STORYLINES

- Atlanta is set to take on the Miami Heat in the final Eastern Conference matchup of the 2025 SoFi NBA Play-In Tournament ... This is the second meeting between these two teams in the Play-In Tournament, as Atlanta (No. 8) took down Miami (No. 7) in the first game of the 2023 Play-In Tournament, 116-105, in Miami ... The winner of Friday's matchup will head to Cleveland to face the No. 1-seeded Cavaliers in the first round of the Eastern Conference Playoffs.
- The Hawks finished the 2024-25 regular season with a 40-42 record, a +4 win increase from the 2023-24 season ... Atlanta averaged 29.6 assists per game in 2024-25, the most assists per game in a single season in franchise history, surpassing the 1960-61 St. Louis Hawks (27.1 apg).
- Trae Young led the entire NBA in total assists (880) and assists per game (11.6), becoming the first Hawk to lead the NBA in assists per game in a single season ... The four-time All-Star appeared in 76 games (all starts), averaging 24.2 points and 11.6 assists, to go along with 3.1 rebounds and 1.2 steals in 36.0 minutes ... He became just the fourth player in NBA history to average at least 24.0 points and 11.0 assists in a single season, joining James Harden (2016-17), Tiny Archibald (1972-73) and Oscar Robertson (3x) ... Young owned 164 more total assists than the next closest player (Nikola Jokic: 716), the largest gap between No. 1 and No. 2 since 2004-05 when Steve Nash (861) had 193 more assists than Stephon Marbury (668).
- Dyson Daniels is coming off a historic 2024-25 campaign, a season in which he became just the fifth player since 1973-74 to average at least 14.0 points (14.1), 5.0 rebounds (5.9), 4.0 assists (4.4) and 3.0 steals (3.01), joining Magic Johnson (1980-81), Michael Jordan (1987-88), Michael Ray Richardson (2x) and Alvin Robertson (4x) ... From 2023-24 to 2024-25, he improved his scoring by +8.3 ppg, rebounds by +2.0 rpg, assists by +1.7 apg and steals by +1.62 spg ... He is just the third player since 1973-74 to own improvements of +8.0 ppg, +2.0 rpg, +1.5 apg and +1.5 spg from one season to the next, per Elias Sports (min. 50 GP), and the first player since Alvin Robertson in 1990-91 to average at least 3.0 steals per game.
- Daniels, also known as the Great Barrier Thief, swiped an NBA-leading 229 total steals this season, the most steals by any player in the 21st century and the most since Gary Payton in 1995-96 (231), a season in which Payton was named Defensive Player of the Year ... He owned 98 more steals than the next closest player (Shai Gilgeous-Alexander: 131), the largest gap between No. 1 and No. 2 in NBA history ... Entering the season, the largest gap between No. 1 and No. 2 was Alvin Robertson (301) over Maurice Cheeks (207) in 1985-86, a season in which Robertson was named Defensive Player of the Year ... Daniels finished the season leading the league in total steals (229 steals + 55 blocks = 284 stocks), becoming the first guard to lead the NBA in total stocks since Michael Jordan in 1987-88, a season in which Jordan was named Defensive Player of the Year.
- Since 1/1, rookie Zaccharie Risacher averaged 14.0 points on .501 FG%, .401 3FG% and .726 FT%, the only rookie over that time to average at least 14.0 points on .500/.400/.700 shooting splits (one of nine players, regardless of rookie status) ... He owned the best TS% (.607%) and second-best eFG% (.591%) amongst all rookies over that time who appeared in at least 30 games (min. 25 mpg) ... Risacher, who was the only rookie to win consecutive Rookie of the Month honors this season (February, March), averaged 12.6 points per game this season, the most by any rookie starting on a postseason team (play-in or playoff) ... He secured the most 30-point outings by a rookie this season (4), including pouring in 38 points in a win over Brooklyn on 4/10, the most points in a single game by a rookie this season.

## DYSON DANIELS: DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR & MOST IMPROVED

- Led the **ENTIRE NBA** in steals (229) and steals per game (3.01) ... Owned the most steals since **GARY PAYTON** in **1995-96** (231), a season in which the Hall-of-Famer was named **Defensive Player of the Year**.
- **INAUGURAL Eastern Conference Defensive Player of the Month** recipient and **ONE OF ONLY TWO PLAYERS** to win the award multiple times.
- **FIRST** player since Hall-of-Famer **SCOTTIE PIPPEN** (1994-95) to have **200+ steals** and **50+ blocks** in a single season.
- **LED** the **ENTIRE NBA** in stocks (steals + blocks), becoming the **FIRST GUARD to LEAD THE LEAGUE** in total stocks since **MICHAEL JORDAN** in 1987-88, a season in which the Hall-of-Famer was named **Defensive Player of the Year**.
- Also **LED THE LEAGUE** in total **STOPS** (steals + blocks + offensive fouls drawn).
- Averaged **CAREER HIGHS** in points per game (14.1), rebounds (5.9), assists (4.3), steals (3.01), blocks (0.72), FG% (.493%) and 3FG% (.340%) ... Just the **FIFTH PLAYER** since 1973-74 to average at least 14.0 ppg, 5.0 rpg, 4.0 apg and 3.0 spg.
- Just the **FIFTH PLAYER** since 1973-74 to improve scoring by +8.0 ppg and steals by +1.5 spg.



## ZACCHARIE RISACHER: ROOKIE OF THE YEAR

- Averaged the **MOST POINTS** by a rookie **STARTING ON A POSTSEASON TEAM** (play-in or playoff).
- Owned the **MOST 30-POINT GAMES** by any rookie this season.
- **ONLY TEENAGER IN NBA HISTORY** with multiple 30-point, zero-turnover games.
- **ONLY ROOKIE** this season to average at least **14.0 points on .500/.400/.700** shooting splits since 1/1 (one of nine players in NBA, regardless of rookie status).
- Had the **HIGHEST OFFENSIVE RATING** amongst all Eastern Conference rookies (112.3, min. 65 GP) and the **BEST TS%** (.607%) and **second-best eFG%** (.591%) amongst all rookies who appeared in 30 games since 1/1 (min. 25 mpg).
- **ONLY ROOKIE THIS SEASON** to earn **BACK-TO-BACK ROOKIE OF THE MONTH** accolades (February and March).



## TRAE YOUNG: CLUTCH PLAYER OF THE YEAR

- Buried **THREE-GAME WINNING** shots this season, **THE MOST** by any player in the NBA (final 10 seconds of fourth quarter of overtime, per Elias Sports).
- Per basketball-reference, knocked down the **LONGEST GAME-WINNING BUZZER-BEATER** of the season on 1/7 at Utah (49 feet).
- Owned the **BEST +/-** by any Eastern Conference player who has appeared in at least 35 clutch games (+34).
- **LED** the **NBA** in total clutch assists and free throws, while ranking third in total clutch three-pointers and third in total clutch points.

The Hawks won the first two games of the series, 120-110 on 12/28 and 98-86 on 2/24 at State Farm Arena ... On 12/28, Trae Young posted his 22nd double-double of the season behind 11 points and a team-high 15 assists, adding one rebound and one steal in 37 minutes ... On 2/24, the Hawks swiped 13 steals, marking Atlanta's 36th game of the season with 10-or-more thefts ... Dyson Daniels recorded his sixth double-double of the season behind 10 points and a career-high tying 11 rebounds, in addition to two assists and seven steals in 34 minutes ... The Heat took the two most recent games, 131-109 on 2/26 and 122-112 on 3/27 at the Kaseya Center ... On 2/26, Zacharie Risacher chipped in 11 points on 4-6 shooting from the floor, in addition to a 2-3 clip from deep and 1-2 from the charity stripe, three rebounds and three assists in 26 minutes ... On 3/27, Trae Young notched 29 points, knocking down 6-12 shots from deep, 12 assists, two rebounds and two steals in 36 minutes of play ... 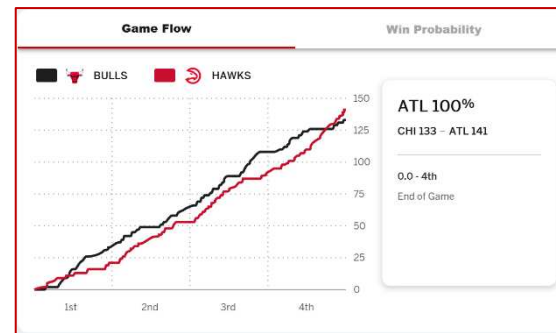
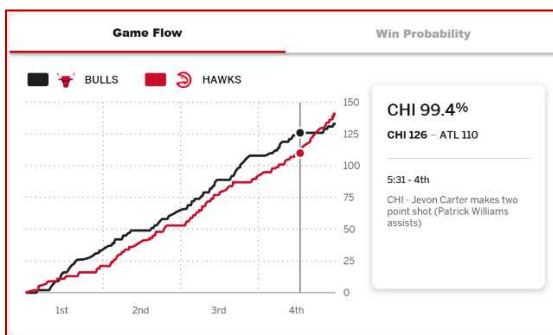
In Atlanta's win over the Toronto Raptors on 12/29, the club swiped **22 STEALS** and **FORCED 31 TURNOVERS**...

- The **SECOND-MOST STEALS** in franchise history and tied with Philadelphia (22, 4/26/21 vs. OKC), Memphis (22, 10/30/10 vs. MIN) and Golden State (22, 11/9/09 vs. MIN) for the most steals in a single game by any team in the NBA since Atlanta's franchise-record 23-steal outing on 4/9/97 at Philadelphia.
- Swiped **13 STEALS** in the first half on 12/29, one shy of tying the franchise record for steals in either half, and had **10 THEFTS** in the **FIRST QUARTER**, setting a new franchise record for most steals in a single quarter.
- The Hawks tallied **SEVEN STEALS** in the first **4:47 of the game**, becoming just the **SECOND TEAM** in the play-by-play era to register at least seven steals in the first five minutes of a game, per Elias Sports.
- The Hawks **FORCED a FRANCHISE-RECORD 31 TURNOVERS** in their win in Toronto, marking just the second time in club history the team has forced at least 30 turnovers in a single game (11/27/93 vs. PHI) ... They became the first team in the NBA since 11/18/15 to force 31 turnovers in a single outing (IND at PHI).



**AN INCREDIBLE BULL COMEBACK:**

The Hawks had an incredible comeback and fourth quarter against the Chicago Bulls on 12/26 ... Overcoming a 21-point third-quarter deficit and a 16-point deficit with 5:31 left to play in regulation...



- With 5:31 left to play in regulation, the Hawks found themselves down by 16 points (126-110) ... Atlanta outscored Chicago **31-7** over the final 5:31 minutes to play, marking the **FIRST TIME** since 4/9/17 the Hawks have **ERASED a deficit of 16-or-more points** in the final 5:30 of action (vs. Cleveland).
- The Hawks **OUTSCORED** the Bulls **50-25** in the final frame, marking the first time since 2/12/21 (vs. San Antonio, +27), the club has outscored their opponent by at least 25 points in the final quarter ... The Hawks recorded only **ONE TURNOVER** in the fourth quarter, becoming **THE FIRST TEAM IN THE PLAY-BY-PLAY ERA** (since 1997-98) to have at totaled at least 50 points, while recording one-or-fewer turnovers (approximately 66,000 fourth quarters played across the NBA over that time).
- In the fourth quarter alone, the Hawks had an offensive rating of 185.2, per NBA.com/Stats, and a defensive rating of 96.2 ... The team's 89.0 net rating in the fourth quarter is their highest net rating in a single quarter all season ... **SHIPPING UP TO ATLANTA:**

In Atlanta's first game of the Emirates NBA Cup 2024, the shorthanded Hawks **TOOK DOWN** the reigning NBA champions 117-116 in Boston, overcoming a 15-point second half deficit ... Atlanta tallied **16 STEALS** in the win, marking **THE MOST STEALS IN A SINGLE GAME** since 1/12/20 at Brooklyn ... The Hawks are the **FIRST TEAM in the NBA** since Miami (10/27/22) to record 16 thefts against the defending NBA champions.

- **DYSON DANIELS** recorded a career-high 28 points, in addition to seven assists, six steals and three rebounds in 41 minutes of action ... At 21 years, 240 days, Daniels is the **YOUNGEST PLAYER** since **LEBRON JAMES** (19 years, 349 days) to notch at least 28 points, seven assists, six steals and three boards in a single game ... Per Stathead, he's just the fourth player to record such a stat line prior to turning 22 years old.
- **JALEN JOHNSON** tallied his second career triple-double (first of the season), finishing with 18 points, 13 rebounds, 10 assists and three steals in 39 minutes ... Johnson, who has swiped at least three steals in each of his triple-doubles, is one of only three Hawks all-time to have multiple triple-double games while recording 3+ thefts ... The 22-year-old forward became the **FIFTH-YOUNGEST** player to register a **TRIPLE-DOUBLE** on the parquet floor in Boston against the Celtics.
- **LARRY NANCE JR.** knocked down a **CAREER-HIGH** five triples (5-6 3FGM) in the win, in addition to 19 points on 7-10 shooting from the field, two rebounds, two assists, one block and one steal in 27 minutes off the bench, while two-way guard **KEATON WALLACE** tallied a near double-double, handing out a career-best eight assists to go along with seven points and two rebounds.
- **ONYEKA OKONGWU** put in the game-winning layup with 6.1 seconds left to play, en route to netting 15 points on 7-11 shooting, six rebounds and two assists in 31 minutes off the bench.

- Georgia Sports, Georgia Radio and Atlanta Sports Hall of Famer Steve Holman is in his 40th season as the "Voice of the Hawks," having broadcasted a span of over 3,200 total games and has now broadcast a Hawks game in five decades (preseason, regular season, postseason) ... His play-by-play streak, which began in March of 1989, is currently at **3,082**, including regular season and playoffs ... On Jan. 18, 2022, Holman was named the 2021 Georgia Sportscaster of the Year by the National Sports Media Association ... Holman has won the award five times in the last eight years (2014, 2016, 2017, 2019, 2022) ... Hawks fans can catch the "Voice of the Hawks" on 92.9 FM The Game.

**HAWKS ON TV:**

- **FanDuel Sports Network**, the new TV and streaming home for the Atlanta Hawks, will televise 79 Atlanta Hawks regular season games for the 2024-25 NBA season with NBA broadcast plans for two additional Hawks games in December to be announced at a later date due to the Emirates NBA Cup. All regular season telecasts on FanDuel Sports Network will be anchored by *Hawks LIVE*, before and after every game. The network will return all five members of its Hawks broadcast team for the 2024-25 season. In addition, **Carl Dukes** will fill in as host/contributor on *Hawks LIVE* for select games for a second straight season.
  - **Bob Rathbun** – Returns for his 29th season as play-by-play announcer for the Atlanta Hawks. Rathbun has been selected to the 2025 Georgia Sports Hall of Fame class.
  - **Dominique Wilkins** – The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Famer will be back for his 16th season as the lead analyst for the team he spent 12 of his 15 seasons playing for in his professional career.
  - **Tabitha Turner** – Enters her second season as sideline reporter for Hawks telecasts.
  - **Treavor Scales** – Fourth consecutive season as the host of *Hawks LIVE*.
  - **Brian Oliver** - Returns for his fourth season as an analyst on *Hawks LIVE* and game analyst. He played four seasons in the NBA and 16 years of professional basketball.

**HONORING SEKOU:**

- On October 21, 2021, the Hawks honored the legacy of former Atlanta Journal-Constitution Hawks beat writer Sekou Smith, who passed away on January 26, 2021, at the age of 48, by naming the redesigned media workroom at State Farm Arena to honor him. The Sekou Smith Press Room was unveiled to a group of Sekou's family and friends prior to the Hawks season opener on October 21, 2021. During the summer of 2021, the team also launched an annual Hawks-NBA Summer League internship in Smith's name. 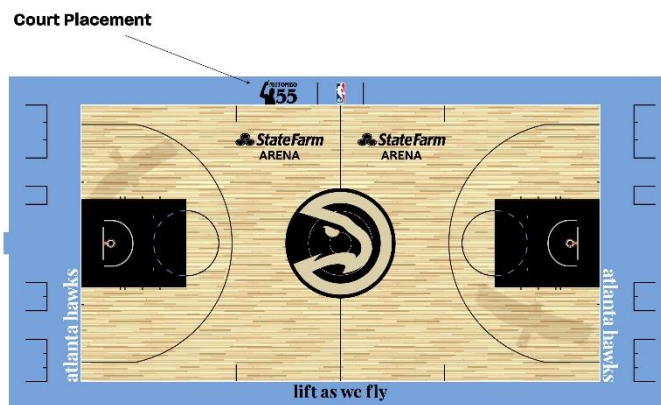


# Hawks Honor Life & Legacy of DIKEMBE MUTOMBO



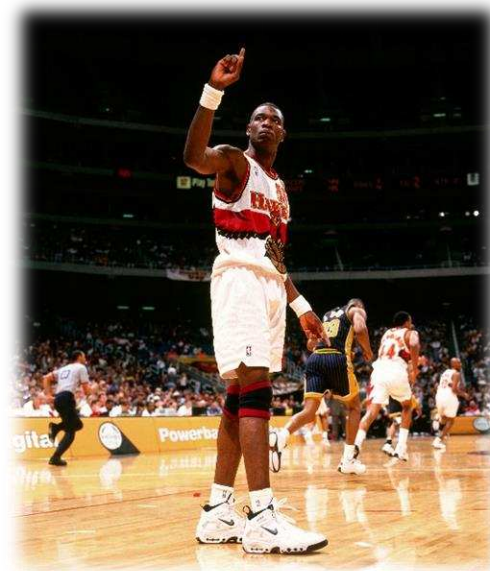
The Atlanta Hawks will honor the life and legacy of Hawks legend and Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall-of-Famer Dikembe Mutombo, who passed away on 9/30/24. On Monday, 11/25, during the game against Dallas presented by Kaiser Permanente and in conjunction with the team’s debut of its Fly City Edition Uniform 2.0, the Hawks are also adding a new court decal as a tribute to Mutombo. Mutombo had his No. 55 jersey retired by the franchise in 2015.

Mutombo, famous for his formidable defensive skills and iconic finger wag after blocks on the court, dedicated himself to humanitarian work, focusing on health care and education in his homeland of the Democratic Republic of the Congo. He founded the Dikembe Mutombo Foundation, which supported various initiatives, including the construction of a state-of-the-art hospital in Kinshasa. His unwavering commitment to community upliftment made him a role model and left a lasting legacy far beyond the basketball court.



## DIKEMBE MUTOMBO

- Appeared in 343 games (all starts) with the Hawks from 1996-2001, averaging 11.9 points, 12.6 rebounds, 1.2 assists and 3.2 blocks in 36.2 minutes (.529 FG%, .692 FT%).
- Four-time NBA Defensive Player of the Year (including twice with the Hawks) and six-time All-Defensive team selection (three with Atlanta).
- Eight-time NBA All-Star (including four times with the Hawks and two-time All-Star starter as a Hawk).
- Owns the second-most blocks in NBA history (3,289).
- One of only four players in NBA history to record over 10,000 points, 10,000 rebounds and 3,000 blocks: Kareem Abdul-Jabbar, Tim Duncan, Dikembe Mutombo, Hakeem Olajuwon.
- One of only three Hawks in franchise history to record a point/rebound/block triple-double and the only player in Hawks history to tally 20+ points, 10+ rebounds and 10+ blocks in a single game (21p/13r/11b, 2/15/00 vs. NJN).
- His No. 55 jersey was retired by the Hawks in 2015, and he entered the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame the same year.
- Ranks first in blocks per game in franchise history (3.2) and third in total blocks (1,094).

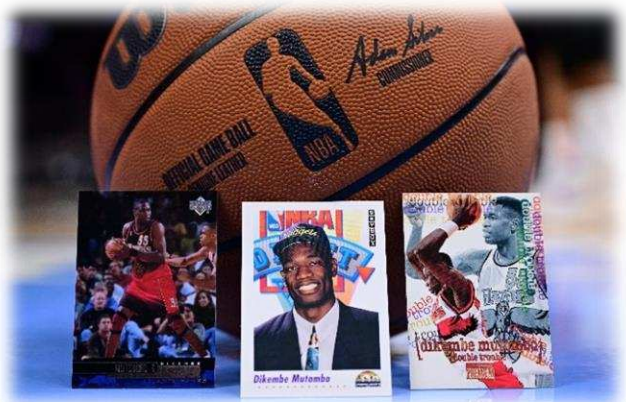

# QUIN SNYDER

Quin Snyder was named the 15th full-time head coach of the Atlanta Hawks on February 26, 2023.

Snyder has led Atlanta to the postseason in each of his first two seasons as the team's coach, reaching the NBA playoffs in 2022-23. The 2023 playoffs marked Snyder's seventh straight playoff appearance, the longest streak in the league at that time.

He owns 418 career regular season wins, the 10th-most among all active head coaches. Snyder won his 400th career game on Jan. 19, as Atlanta won at Miami, 109-108.

Snyder served as head coach of the Utah Jazz from the 2014-15 to 2021-22 seasons, accumulating a 372-264 record (.585) and leading the Jazz to the playoffs in six of his eight seasons. Over his final six seasons (2016-17 to 2021-22), the Jazz compiled a 294-178 record, the third-highest winning percentage (.623) in the NBA and best in the Western Conference over that span. Utah started the 2020-21 season with a 23-5 record, earning Snyder the honor of being named the head coach of the 2021 Western Conference All-Star team, and finished the regular season with the best record in the NBA (52-20; .722) and the fifth-highest single-season winning percentage in franchise history. His 372 wins are the second-most in Jazz history behind only Jerry Sloan.

Snyder finished Top 10 in NBA Coach of the Year voting in four-of-five seasons between 2017-21, including second in 2018, third in 2021, sixth in 2017 and eighth in 2019. He is a four-time Western Conference Coach of the Month.

The Jazz reached the playoffs in six consecutive seasons, advancing to the Western Conference Semifinals on three occasions (2017, 2018 and 2021).

Before his hiring by the Jazz in 2014-15, Snyder was an assistant coach with the Hawks during the 2013-14 season on Mike Budenholzer's staff.

Prior to joining the Hawks in 2013-14, Snyder worked as an assistant coach for CKSA Moscow (2012-13), the Los Angeles Lakers (2011-12) and Philadelphia 76ers (2010-11). From 2007-10, Snyder was head coach of the Austin Toros (the NBA G League affiliate of the San Antonio Spurs), recording a 94-56 (.627) mark, while leading the Toros to three straight playoff appearances and the 2008 National Basketball Development League championship game. He was the 2008-09 D-League Coach of the Year.

Snyder began his head coaching career at the University of Missouri in 1999, where in seven seasons, he led the Tigers to a 128-96 (.571) record, and four NCAA Tournaments including an Elite Eight appearance. Prior to starting with Missouri, he served as a with assistant with the Los Angeles Clippers (1992-93) and at Duke (1995-99) under Mike Krzyzewski.

Snyder was named a McDonald's All-American at Mercer Island High School. He played in 136 games over four years (1985-89) at Duke University, reaching three Final Fours and earning Academic All-American honors.

Snyder earned undergraduate degrees in philosophy and political science from Duke, later earning a Juris Doctor and Master's in Business Administration (MBA) from Duke as well. He is a native of Mercer Island, WA.

Also tallied his 211th point/assist double-double of his career, passing Stephon Marbury and Rajon Rondo for the 23rd-most such double-doubles in NBA history.
- Recorded 23 points and 12 assists at New Orleans on 11/3, posting his 161st career 20-point/10-assist game tying Jerry West for the 12th-most in NBA history.
- Tallied his 69th straight game of 10+ points and 5+ assists against Sacramento on 11/1, breaking a tie with himself for the fourth-longest such streak in NBA history.
- Notched his 208th career double-double against Washington on 10/28, passing Josh Smith for the seventh-most double-doubles in franchise history ... Young tallied 14 points, 13 assists, one steal and one block in 36 minutes.
